# STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2013

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is governed by its Constitution dated 3 July 2004.

New Trustees are appointed either to fill a casual vacancy or by way of addition to the Board. Particular emphasis is placed upon the appointment of Trustees with knowledge and experience relevant to the Society's charitable activities. When new Trustees are appointed they are given an introduction to the work of the Herculaneum Society and provided with the information they need to fulfil their roles, which includes information about the roles of the Trustees and their responsibilities under the charities act 1993.

Day-to-day administration of the Society is delegated to an administrator under the supervison of the Trustees. Decision-making powers are retained by Council and exercised at regular Trustees meetings.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The object of the Society as stated in the Constitution is "to advance the education to the public concerning the World Heritage Site of Herculaneum by promoting and supporting the work of the Herculaneum Society". The aims of the Herculaneum Society in turn are:

to advance the education of the public concerning the World Heritage Site of Herculaneum, in particular to create an archive of materials relating to the World Heritage Site at Herculaneum and the work of the Herculaneum Society;

to promote research into the herculaneum, including the continued investigation of the Villa of the Papyri at , and the Herculaneum publication of the useful results of such research;

to promote the conservation, for the benefit of the public, of the artefacts and the buildings at Herculaneum.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

During the past year the Friends of Herculaneum and the associated charity, the Herculaneum Society, have been assisted by the Patron memberships of D. Clark, R. Fowler, K. Lavery and R. Michel, and the Benefactor memberships of G. Shaw, J. Taylor, and N. Wilson, and donations from L. Holford-Strevens, P. Hooker and K. Starling. These donations totalled £9,850 before Gift Aid. We thank these individuals and all members of the Society, including thirteen schools who have taken out Schools Memberships, for their contributions.

The Society has had an active year. Membership of the Friends stands at 135, plus the schools. The fourth biennial Herculaneum Congress was held 22-24 June 2012 in Ercolano, attended by some 40 members. A full account of this event may be found in Issue 15 of the Friends newsletter, Herculaneum Archaeology. The second event of the year was a speaker meeting at the Ioannou Centre, Oxford on 13 October 2012, at which, after the Annual General Meeting of the Friends, Prof. Dr Oliver Primavesi of the University of Munich spoke on 'Winckelmann in Portici 1762: The Discovery of the Polychromy of Greek Sculpture'. The series Sozomena, published for the Herculaneum Society by De Gruyter of Berlin, now comprises fourteen volumes. The American Friends of Herculaneum continued its operations, and applied for affiliated status with the American Philological Association.

Plans for the near future include publicity and a spring meeting in conjunction with the British Museum exhibition Life and Death in Pompeii and Herculaneum; collaboration with the American Friends in a conference at the British Academy on 5 August 2013; a schools competition; the awarding of three student bursaries; and the organisation of the Fifth Herculaneum Congress in spring 2014. A campaign to raise funds for a Public Education Coordinator at Herculaneum will be carried out. The website, archive, newsletter and monograph series will continue to be developed and published.

### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

**Reserves policy** 

The Friends of Herculaneum Society has a policy of retaining sufficient unrestricted reserves to finance its planned activates and meet its financial obligations.

For this purpose, the Trustees have established systems to monitor financial performance and to forecast the future commitments and reserves for a minimum of 18 months ahead. Where any potential shortfall is identified, The of Friends Herculaneum Society has a policy of amending planned future activities or cutting overhead costs in order to maintain a sufficient level of unrestricted reserves.

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Accounting convention**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

# **Resources expended**

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
