REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2008

The Trustees present herewith the accounts for the year ended 30 April 2008.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Herculaneum Society is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 15 June 2004.

New Trustees are appointed either to fill a casual vacancy or by way of addition to the board. Particular emphasis is placed upon the appointment of the Trustees with knowledge and experience relevant to the charitable company's activities. When new Trustees are appointed they are given an introduction to the work of the Herculaneum Society and provided with the information they need to fulfil their roles, which includes information about the roles of the Trustees and their responsibilities under the Companies and Charities Acts.

Day to day administration of the Society is delegated to an administrator under the supervision of the trustees. Decision-making powers are retained by the Council and exercised at regular Trustees' meetings.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the company are to advance the education of the public concerning the World Heritage Site at Herculaneum, to promote research into Herculaneum, and to promote the conservation of the artefacts and the buildings at Herculaneum.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The Friends of Herculaneum Society and the Herculaneum Society, have in the course of the year made good progress. Membership of Friends stands at 155. Two very successful and well-attended public events have been held. The first was a two-day conference in Oxford on the "The Villa of the Papyri at Herculaneum: Archaeology, Reception and Digital Reconstruction" (22-23 September 2007) attended by some 100 delegates. The programme included lectures by distinguished speakers from the UK, Europe and USA on many topics pertinent to the Villa, and the Annual General Meeting of the Friends (22 September 2007). The second was a speaker meeting held at the University of Bristol (1 March 2008), where invited speakers gave lectures on the excavations of Amedeo Maiuri, Roman libraries, and the recently published feasibility study on the Villa of the Papyri. Issues 7 and 8 of *Herculaneum Archaeology* have been published. A bursary of £1000 was awarded to a postgraduate conducting research on Herculaneum. The archive and the website http://www.herculaneum.ox.ac.uk have been updated and expanded.

Plans for the following year include the second Naples Congress (29 May - 1 June 2008), the Annual General Meeting (11 October 2008), and an event to be Paris in June 2009. The website will continue to be developed, and two new issues of the newsletter *Herculaneum Archaeology* will appear in the course of the year. The first volume will appear of a new series entitled *Sozomena: Studies in the Recovery of Ancient Texts*, published by the distinguished house of Walter de Gruyter, Berlin, in the name of Herculaneum Society. *Sozomena* will also publish the proceedings of the Villa of the Papyri conference. A student bursary will be awarded in conjunction with the newly opened Centro Internazionale per gli Studi di Herculaneum (Ercolano)

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The Herculaneum Society has a policy of retaining sufficient unrestricted reserves to finance its planned activities and meet its future financial obligations.

For this purpose, the Trustees have established systems to monitor financial performance and to forecast the future commitments and reserves for a minimum of 18 months ahead. Where any potential shortfall is identified, The Herculaneum Society has a policy of amending planned future activities or cutting overhead costs in order to maintain a sufficient level of unrestricted reserves.

This policy is reviewed on an annual basis.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007), the Companies Act 1985 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
